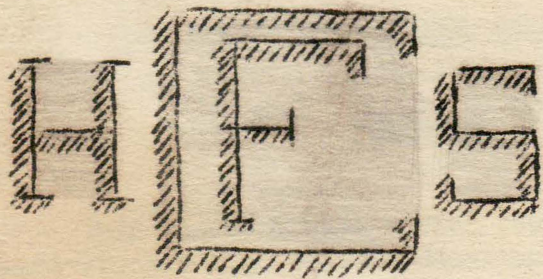

ATTENDANCE

TARDINESS - A pupil must be in his home room before 8:30 A. M. Pupils who are tardy must get an excuse from the office before reporting to his home room.
