

#### ATTENDANCE

TARDINESS - A pupil must be in his home room before 8:30 A. M. Pupils who are tardy must get an excuse from the office before reporting to his home room.

ABSENCE - Pupils who are absent from school must bring an excuse from home signed by a parent or guardian the day they return to school. These excuses must be classified by the Attendance Officer and then be given to the home room teacher.

DISMISSAL - Pupils will be dismissed at 3:45 P. M. every day.
